Professor Jennifer Finney Boylan is the inaugural Anna Quindlen Writer in Residence at Columbia's Barnard College and a faculty member of both the Breadloaf Writers' Conference and the Sirenland Writers' Conference in Positano, Italy. Boylan is the author of eighteen books, including her memoir, She's Not There: a Life in Two Genders, which was the first bestselling work by a transgender American. Her most recent book is the novel Mad Honey, co-authored with Jodi Picoult.

Jessie Greengrass is the author of the award winning short story collection, An Account of the Decline of the Great Auk, According to One Who Saw It, and two critically acclaimed novels. Her most recent novel, The High House, was shortlisted for the 2021 Costa Novel Award. Greengrass studied philosophy in Cambridge and now lives in Berwick-upon-Tweed, Northumberland, with her partner and children.

Samantha Hunt is the author of five books, among them short

Hernan Diaz is the author of two novels. Trust is a New York Times Bestseller and winner of both the Pulitzer and the Kirkus Prize. Trust has been listed as one of the 10 Best Books of the Year by The New York Times and other publications and as one of Barack Obama's Favorite Books of 2022. In the Distance was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize and the PEN/Faulkner Award. Diaz holds a PhD from NYU and edits an academic journal at Columbia University.

Kirk Wallace Johnson is an author and screenwriter. He has published three books and his work has appeared in The New Yorker, the New York Times, 60 Minutes, and elsewhere. Johnson is a senior fellow at the USC Annenberg Center on Communication Leadership and Policy, and he founded the List Project to Resettle Iraqi Allies. Johnson's most recent book is The Fishermen and the Dragon: Fear, Greed, and a Fight for Justice on the Gulf Coast.



Sebastian Junger is the New York Times bestselling author of Tribe, War, A Death in Belmont, Fire, The Perfect Storm and Freedom, and co director of the documentary film Restrepo, which was nominated for an Academy Award. He is also the winner of a Peabody Award and the National Magazine Award for Reporting. He lives in New York City with his family.



Jodi Picoult is the #1 New York Times bestselling author of twenty-eight novels, including Wish You Were Here, The Book of Two Ways, A Spark of Light, Small Great Things, Leaving Time, and with daughter Samantha van Leer, two young adult novels, Between the Lines and Off the Page. Her most recent book Mad Honey is a collaboration with Jennifer Finney Boylan.

Luke Russert is an author and an Emmy Award winning journalist who served as an NBC News correspondent from 2008 to 2016. After leaving media, Russert embarked on a three year, six continent travel expedition that took him to nearly seventy countries. Published by Harper Horizon, his first book, Look For Me There, is a reflection of his deeply personal internal journey across many diverse external places.

Stacy Schiff is the author of, among others, *The Witches: Salem*, 1692, Cleopatra: A Life and Véra (Mrs. Vladimir Nabokov), winner of the Pulitzer Prize. Hailed as a "tour de force," her most recent book, The Revolutionary: Samuel Adams, was named one of The Wall Street Journal's Best 10 Books of 2022 and also figured on President Obama's list of Best 10 Books of 2022.

Sally Bedell Smith is the *New York Times* best-selling author of eight biographies. Her latest, George VI and Elizabeth: The Marriage That Saved the Monarchy (Random House 2023), is the definitive biography of the late Queen Elizabeth II's mother and father, based for the first time on special access to their letters and diaries in the Royal Archives at Windsor Castle that was granted to the author by the Queen.

Sarah Stodola is the author of two books: *The Last Resort*: A Chronicle of Paradise, Profit, and Peril at the Beach (2022), a cultural history of the beach resort that examines its growing importance in the world economy, as well as its future in the face of climate change, and Process: The Writing Lives of Great Authors (2015), a narrative journey through the writing habits of 18 famous writers.
